A RESOLUTION CREATING A ROMAN CATHOLIC ARCHDIOCESE OF ATLANTA CENSUS 2020 COMPLETE COUNT COMMITTEE CAMPAIGN TO PLAN AND CONDUCT LOCAL EDUCATIONAL INITIATIVES, PUBLICITY AND PROMOTIONAL ACTIVITIES TO INCREASE PARISH COMMUNITY AWARENESS AND PARTICIPATION IN THE 2020 CENSUS

WHEREAS, the social teaching of the Catholic Church is based on and inseparable from our understanding of human life and human dignity. Every human being is created in the image of God and redeemed by Jesus Christ, and therefore is invaluable and worthy of respect as a member of the human family. Every person, from the moment of conception to natural death, has inherent dignity and a right to life consistent with that dignity; and

WHEREAS, the United States of America has performed a nationwide census every ten years since 1790, with the last census being in 2010; and

WHEREAS, accurate census information is critical to planning for the future social and human needs of the State of Georgia; and

WHEREAS, the more informed that residents become about the 2020 census operations, the better their understanding of the census process becomes, thus increasing their willingness to participate in the 2020 Census; and

WHEREAS, the Census Bureau is not permitted to publicly release responses furnished by any individual, or on behalf of an individual, or release information to any governmental agencies, including the Internal Revenue Service, the Immigration and Naturalization Service, law enforcement agencies or welfare agencies. In addition, per the Federal Cybersecurity Enhancement Act of 2015, census data is protected from cybersecurity risks through screening of the systems that transmit this data; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Complete Count Committee Campaign will be to support the social teaching of the Catholic Church concerning state and federally funded programs that promote human dignity and to assist the State of Georgia in obtaining the most accurate and complete population count for Census 2020 by increasing the number of responses through focused, structured parish outreach programs. The Campaign will utilize the local knowledge, expertise and influence of the parishes to design and implement census awareness programs targeted to each participating parish community.

THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the current Diocesan Administrator of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Atlanta that:

- 1. A Census 2020 Complete Count Committee Campaign is hereby established to support the social teaching of the Catholic Church concerning state and federally funded programs that promote human dignity and to assist the State of Georgia in obtaining the most accurate and complete population count for Census 2020.
- 2. The Campaign shall be implemented and managed by the Archdiocese of Atlanta's Justice and Peace Ministries in the Office of Life, Dignity and Justice; working in concert with other archdiocesan offices and organizations, as well as census bureau officials, as appropriate and necessary. The Campaign will include preparing public service announcements for various forms of traditional and social media and materials for general information.
- 3. The Campaign shall include the organization of pastor-approved Parish Complete Count Committees focused on working with committee members and census bureau officials to enhance and increase the response rate to the Census 2020. The Parish Complete Count Committees will support parish response strategies and techniques through planning and conducting local educational initiatives, and distributing posters, flyers and handouts for use by the parishes and others within the State of Georgia. All materials to be distributed and information to be communicated shall be forwarded to Justice and Peace Ministries for approval by the Archdiocesan Office of Communications prior to use.
- 4. The Campaign shall run from August 2019 through and including June 2020 at which time the Campaign, having run its course, shall dissolve, unless extended by the current Archbishop or Administrator of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Atlanta. No resolution dissolving or rescinding the Campaign is necessary.
