Please keep in mind that if you are thinking of transferring you should contact the Office of the Permanent Diaconate BEFORE you start shopping for a new parish assignment. We have a protocol and the Archbishop is the one who makes these assignments. If we preempt the process, we run the risk of alienating both your current pastor and whoever you have spoken to about

the move. Let us do our back channel work before making this a public move. Just a call or an email can begin the process.

I pray all of you have a safe and restful summer. I know I plan on some quality family time as well as the quiet of the coast and the mountains in the next month.

Come July 22 I hope to see many of you in New Orleans as we celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the Restoration of the Permanent Diaconate here in the US. What a joy it will be. As of today, we have nearly 3000 people coming to the event. There is more information about the Congress in the following pages. We are on Summer Break from regular Diaconate Formation Classes, but not from Diaconate Formation. The months of June and July will have no classes, so what will those in Diaconate Formation do with all of their free time?

The Eucharistic Congress is held this year on the first weekend of the summer

break. All of the men in formation and many of their wives volunteer hours and hours to do the many tasks that help the Archdiocese host this wonderful event. From the transportation of the stands that hold the banners and the poles used in the procession on Saturday morning, as well as all of the supplies needed (including a very heavy tabernacle), to clean up, those in Diaconate Formation gladly work everywhere and anywhere they are needed.

The Summer Break will also hold the opportunity for some of the men to go on a mission trip to help the poorest of the poor; others are working at Vacation Bible Schools in their parish; some will go on summer camp trips with youth groups.

We share with the men and

wives to also take some time to read a book (not required reading for one of their courses), relax in a hammock, go fishing, play with the kids, golf, spend quiet time with God. No matter who we are, we all need Sabbath time. Time away from the routine to find rest in God – a very important part of formation.

There is an important difference between education and formation. Education requires 'head knowledge', which is very important to those who will serve as deacons to know scripture, theology, and doctrine. Formation, though, requires that we are formed by faith, and God shapes our whole life.

We seek ways to help those in Diaconate Formation to encounter the living God and grow in the love of God. To do so, we step away from the everyday and let the Spirit seep into our very being, refresh our souls and our bodies too.


While we are on break from classes, we have work to do – to deepen our relationship with God.
