DECLARATION OF NULLITY OF MARRIAGE APPLICATION FORM

INSTRUCTIONS

The present form can be filled in either by hand or on the computer. If you choose to use your computer, you will need the program Acrobat Reader, which you can download for free from the website adobe.com. Do not use your browser, as it won't allow you to save your file. If you choose to handwrite your answers, please write legibly. In any case, do not forget to sign where it is indicated.

Do not begin filling out this application until you have met with a Tribunal Advocate. Inquire in your parish or contact the Metropolitan Tribunal to learn how to select an Advocate.

Do not rush through the questionnaire. Answer all the questions as completely as possible. Taking some time now will save you time later. Please do not leave any blank answers. If something does not apply to your case, write "N/A."

In this questionnaire, you are the "Petitioner", and the other spouse of the marriage in question is the "Respondent".

The mailing address of the Respondent is extremely important. Making sure that the address is correct will avoid delays. If you cannot provide the address for the Respondent, you will have to provide documentation of your efforts to locate it.

If you, the Respondent, or your witnesses change addresses, notify the Tribunal as soon as possible.

It is not possible to know in advance how long this process will take. Do not set a date for a wedding before this process has finished.

DOCUMENTS

All the following documents must be submitted:

- This form, completely filled in, with no blank answers, and all the required signatures.
- If the marriage was celebrated in the Catholic Church, canonical Certificate of Marriage.
- Recent Baptismal Certificate for the Petitioner, issued within the last 6 months. If you are a Catholic now, but you were baptized in a non-Catholic community, certificate of your reception in the Catholic Church.
- Complete and accurate mailing address of the Respondent. If you do not know it, you must prove your efforts to locate the Respondent. No petition can be accepted without this information.
- Civil Marriage License or Marriage Certificate for the marriage in question.
- Civil Decree of Divorce for the marriage in question (containing judge's signature).

Please keep a copy of any documents you submit to the Tribunal, in case they are lost in the mail.

AGREEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING

1. I understand that, if the Tribunal accepts my case for consideration, it cannot and does not guarantee that an affirmative decision will be given in the case.
2. I understand that the Tribunal cannot ever guarantee that a case will be concluded by a certain date. As such, I agree to wait until I receive a final decision in writing from the Tribunal before I set a definite date for a marriage in the Catholic Church.
3. I understand and accept that Church law obligates the Tribunal to contact the Respondent and present him or her with the opportunity to participate in the process. Therefore, I acknowledge that I must provide the Tribunal with the full current address of my former spouse. All reasonable efforts to locate my former spouse must be exhausted to the satisfaction of the Tribunal. The requirement of contacting my former spouse may be omitted only in the most extreme circumstances, and only then with the approval of the Judicial Vicar.
4. I understand that I must contact my witnesses personally to inform them that I have started this case. I will ask my witnesses to respond to the Tribunal.
5. I understand that the Metropolitan Tribunal of Atlanta, in the investigation of the case, may employ the services of a court expert or other expert witness and I hereby authorize the Tribunal to disclose complete information concerning my case to such a professional for case review. Upon completion of the case, I also authorize the Tribunal to release information regarding the case to a psychological expert, counselor, priest, or deacon for follow-up counseling as well as for pre-marital preparation presently or in the future. It is understood that otherwise all contents of this investigation will be kept confidential, reserved exclusively to the parties to the case and to the staff of the Tribunal, according to the canon law of the Roman Catholic Church.
6. I understand that if, with occasion of the instruction of the case, the Metropolitan Tribunal were to learn about specific information, then by law the Metropolitan Tribunal may be required to report such information to legal authorities. Such information may include names or situations in which a minor has been subjected to physical or sexual abuse or neglect. I release the Archdiocese of Atlanta and its agents from any liability for disclosure of information to appropriate legal authorities about abuse of a minor.
7. I also understand that if, with occasion of the instruction of the case, the Metropolitan Tribunal were to learn about specific information regarding abuse (past or present) by clergy or other professional employees or volunteers of the various parishes and institutions of the Roman Catholic Church, this information will be reported to the Office of the Archbishop of Atlanta.
8. In order to assist the Tribunal to maintain an atmosphere of candor and openness in testimony and in recognition of the spiritual and religious nature of these proceedings, I voluntarily waive now, and in the future, any rights under civil law to subpoena the acts of the case in judicial discovery. This waiver is given without reservation, condition or limit of time.
9. I agree to keep confidential and secret any information that I shall learn in the course of the proceeding because all testimony in this case is given for the possible ecclesiastical declaration of nullity of my marriage; and, because my interest is solely to present my case to the Tribunal, I promise not to use information that I may learn through the case in any other forum or for any other purpose.
10. I understand that no fees will be charged for any cases submitted to the Metropolitan Tribunal of Atlanta. However I acknowledge that a fee will be assessed in a case transmitted to Rome on appeal and that the party who initiates the appeal will be responsible for the fee.

GROUNDS

The grounds are the reason or reasons why you claim that your marriage was invalid. Therefore, it is extremely important that you identify the grounds correctly.

The following questions are oriented to discover the existence of grounds. Once you have answered the questions, speak with your Advocate, who will help you to identify the grounds for your case.

Provide as much detail as possible. Do not give short answers. If you need additional space, you may continue on a separate sheet of paper.

NOTE: For Catholics, "wedding" means the wedding in the Catholic Church (sometimes called "blessing" or "convalidation"), not a prior civil ceremony.

1. Were you raised in a normal, healthy family environment? If not, explain the main difficulties that you experienced.
2. Was the Respondent raised in a normal, healthy family environment? If not, explain the main difficulties that the Respondent experienced.
3. Do you have any psychological or emotional problems, grave or mild, diagnosed or not? If yes, please describe.
4. Does the Respondent have any psychological or emotional problems, grave or mild, diagnosed or not? If yes, please describe.
5. If it is the case, were these psychological problems already present at the time of the wedding?
6. If it is the case, were these psychological problems the reason for the failure of the marriage?

7. Have you or the Respondent struggled with addiction to drugs, alcohol, gambling, etc.? If yes, please describe.

8. If it is the case, at the time of the wedding, were you or the Respondent already addicted? If so, please explain.

9. During the wedding ceremony, were you or the Respondent under the influence of drugs or alcohol? If so, please explain.

10. Have you ever experienced any kind of sexual disorder? If yes, please explain.

11. Has the Respondent experienced any kind of sexual disorder? If yes, please explain.

12. Were any of the problems that you have described so far the reason for the failure of the marriage? If so, please explain.

13. At the time of the wedding, were you or the Respondent significantly immature, naïve or young? If so, please explain.

14. At the time of the wedding, were there any other factors impairing your reason or your freedom? If so, please explain.

15. Were your courtship and engagement peaceful, or did you have significant arguments and breakups? Please explain.

16. What prompted your decision to marry?

17. At the time of the wedding, were you mistaken about a quality of the Respondent which was so important for you that, if you had known about it, you would not have married? If so, please explain.

18. At the time of the wedding, was the Respondent mistaken about a quality of yours which was so important for the Respondent that, if he or she had known about it, they would not have married you? If so, please explain.

19. Did you or the Respondent give your consent honestly, or did you have other intentions in mind, different than the desire to start a family together? Please explain.

20. Did you or the Respondent marry with the purpose of regularizing your or the Respondent's immigration status? If so, please explain.

21. At the time of the wedding, were you or the Respondent open to the possibility that the marriage could end in divorce? If so, why?

22. At the time of the wedding, did you or the Respondent reserve the right to get a divorce? If so, why?

23. At the time of the wedding, were you or the Respondent determined to avoid having children? If so, please explain?

24. At the time of the wedding were you or the Respondent determined to limit the number of your offspring in some way? If so, please explain.

25. At the time of the wedding, were you or the Respondent being unfaithful to each other? If so, please explain.

26. At the time of the wedding, were you or the Respondent open to the possibility of having sex with other people? If so, please explain.

27. Did you decide to marry out of mutual love or were there other influences and motives? Please explain.

28. Did you or the Respondent give your matrimonial consent under pressure? If so, what were these pressures?
29. At the time of the wedding, did you or someone else conceal something important from the Respondent? If so, please explain.
30. Did the Respondent or someone else conceal something important from you that you only learned after the wedding? If so, please explain.
31. What were the main problems during the time that you were together as a married couple?
32. What was the reason for the final separation?

With the information gathered in the previous questions, now meet with your Advocate and determine which are the grounds for your case. Your Advocate will tell you the technical name of each ground so that you can write it down on the Petition page.

WITNESSES

Once you have identified the possible grounds for your case with the help of your Advocate, now you need to name witnesses to support your claim.

Only name witnesses who know about the facts that you allege made your marriage invalid. The best witnesses are usually friends, co-workers, family members, roommates, or others who knew both you and the Respondent before the marriage and at the time of the wedding. It is essential that you do not instruct the witnesses what they are to tell to the Tribunal. They must give independent, honest testimony.

Before submitting their names, personally contact each witness and make sure they are willing to give their testimony. It is the policy of this Tribunal not to hear the testimony of the children of the parties.

Usually, the number of witnesses is between 3 and 5. In any case, the witnesses' quality is more important than their quantity.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILLING IN THE PETITION PAGE

The following page is a legal document in which you formally request a declaration of nullity of your marriage from the Metropolitan Tribunal of Atlanta.

You do not need to write the full addresses for you and the Respondent on the Petition page, only the city and state.

Only write the full name of each of your witnesses, you do not need to provide their addresses on the Petition page.

It is important that you complete the Petition only after you have met with your Advocate and identified the grounds you intend to propose. Your Advocate will tell you how to write the names of the grounds, always indicating if each ground pertains to the Petitioner, the Respondent, or both.
