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PETITION I respectfully petition the ecclesiastical authority to declare that the wedding referenced here was not celebrated in the required canonical form and, therefore, cannot be considered valid. Signature of Petitioner Date Printed Name Parish Name The Priest or Deacon has two alternatives: Option One – I attach my signed attestation to the application and other documents for the parish prenuptial file. I send a copy of my attestation and the application form to the Tribunal for recording. Originals go in prenuptial file. Option Two – I send my signed attestation and a copy of the application form to the Tribunal. The original documents stay in the parish prenuptial file. The signed copy will be returned to me for the file. **OPTION ONE:** I have examined the baptismal certificate of the Catholic party and find no notation of a marriage celebrated according to canonical form. The civil marriage certificate confirms that canonical form was not observed. The Petitioner has attested that the marriage was not celebrated according to canonical form, that no dispensation from canonical form was ever granted, and that no convalidation took place. Therefore, in accordance with Dignitas Conubii, art. 5 §3, and canon 1108, I conclude that the marriage described in this application was null in Catholic Church law due to lack of canonical form. **OPTION TWO:** I have conducted the prenuptial investigation required by the Code of Canon Law (1983), canons 1066-1071, and Dignitas Conubii, art. 5 §3, for the marriage of the Petitioner named above, whose previous marriage did not conform with the required canonical form (canon 1108). I have examined a recent copy of the Petitioner's baptismal certificate, on which there is no notation of a marriage celebrated in the Catholic Church; the civil marriage certificate for the union, which confirms the same; and the Petitioner's attestation that the marriage was not celebrated according to canonical form. I hereby request a declaration that the prior marriage was null in Catholic Church law by reason of lack of canonical form.
