IN REMEMBRANCE OF

Father Richard Morrow





This fall, Father Richard Morrow would be celebrating his 90th birthday and 65 years of priesthood. His presence warmed the soul of all those he encountered. Truly, he embodied our mission to know, love, and serve as Jesus did.

In his early years of ministry, he served as chaplain to the Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center. "It's an assignment I'm grateful for now," he said. "There I learned about the sick and what the sick were dealing with."

He continued this legacy of caring for the sick at the eleven parishes he served and in his ministry to Piedmont Hospital. Since 1996, Father Morrow visited the hospital twice a week and saw upwards of 25,000 patients, plus family members and friends. In these visits, he provided the Sacrament of the Eucharist to them, anointed them with the Sacrament of the Sick, prayed with them, and listened to them. While at Piedmont, he baptized, blessed, and prayed with countless babies, both premature ones in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit and ones in the nursery.

At his funeral in June, Archbishop Beltran said, "Like the good shepherd he was, Father Morrow reached out to everyone. His many years of priestly service were filled with love and devotion. His ministry brought Jesus to people and people to Jesus."

May we continue his legacy and commit ourselves to bringing Jesus to people and people to Jesus.







FATHER MORROWAT HIS 65TH ANNIVERSARY MASS

On Thursday, June 20, 2019, we celebrated the 25th Anniversary of the Perpetual Adoration Chapel at Christ the King with Mass, Adoration, and dinner. We recognized guardians who have prayed weekly adoration hours in the Chapel for over 20 years and dedicated substitute guardians, three of whom had filled in over 60 times for guardians who could not make their regular hour.

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Adoration provides me an opportunity to experience offering up prayers of thanksgiving and petitions of others. It is the stillness of the overnight hours, the solitude, with no interruptions, where I become most deeply immersed in the Lord's presence.

In a partnership with a local theology professor, a six week Class on Angelology and a Saturday morning Day of Reflection on Divine Mercy were offered. The Cathedral has continued to lead the archdiocese in VIRTUS courses to protect and love God's children. All clergy, staff, and volunteers serving our youth learn the signs of and how to prevent sexual abuse, as well as how to respond appropriately. During the year, our four trained facilitators offered 42 training sessions, teaching over 1,500 participants. 437 of our Cathedral children were provided age appropriate training on touching safely, boundaries, and safety rules. Additionally, in partnership with the Georgia Center for Child Advocacy, we offered an open session to our parents on "getting comfortable with uncomfortable conversations."

Why do you love?

In the heart of our ministry is our calling from Jesus to love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength in addition to loving our neighbors as ourselves. We believe the best way to follow Jesus with others is through forming community and sharing our faith with each other. Our men's and women's clubs, small groups, and young adult ministry all provide the parish with opportunities to develop friendships, discover ways to grow spiritually, and serve the parish and Atlanta community.





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After a blessed recovery from a stroke a few years ago, God led me to Stephen Ministry to serve others in His name. I find great joy in being "the face of Christ" to those dealing with life's crises, seeking His Hope, His Mercy, and His Love. Why do you serve?

As a part of our Parish School of Religion (PSR) last year, over 500 youth in grades P-K through 5th expereinced the presence of God and answered His call to serve by donating toys, games, and food to support the less fortunate and sick during the Christmas season. In addition, they made 800 sack lunches for the Atlanta Union Mission to provide meals for those living on the streets of our city, wrote cards of prayer and encouragement for those sick in our parish, prepared Easter baskets to bring cheer for the elderly visited by our Pastoral Care team, and provided gift boxes for needy children in the community to be distributed by MUST ministries.



SERVICE IN ACTION

Misión de Cristo Rey







One of our largest forms of outreach at the Cathedral is supporting the Hispanic Misión on Buford Highway. Since renting the new space for the Misión in 2015, the congregation has grown from one Sunday Mass for 300 to three Masses a week with standing room only and 700 seats full. In addition to weekly Mass and confessions, the Misión provides liturgies custom to many hispanic countries including presentaciones for newborns, quinceañeras for 15 year old girls, Dia de los Muertos in remembrance of the dead, Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe, and more.

The Misión has grown tremendously because it feels like home for many hispanic immigrant and expat families in the Atlanta area. This Christmas, the Misión led a multicultural advent novena led by parishioners from El Salvador, Mexico, Columbia, Venezuela, Guatamala, and the Dominican Republic.

As a place of outreach, the Misión provides computer classes, English literacy classes in partnership with the Mexican counsel, GED assistance programs, prostate exams in partnership with Piedmont Hospital, and health screenings.

This year, we added two days of religious education classes at the Misión and Mass, Adoration, and Confession on Wednesdays. We also offered an Advent and Lenten mission that included a guest speaker and penance service. New this year was a parent and godparent retreat for children receiving sacraments at the Easter Vigil and First Communions in May.

New Hyland Center + Cafeteria + Media Center







Thanks to the generousity of our Christ the King family, mid-way through last fiscal year, we reached our \$30 million goal for the Continue His Mission capital campaign. This was a year of construction, patience, flexibility, and excitement as the Hyland Center began to take shape. We are looking forward to opening the new Hyland Center soon and seeing it come to life as our recreation program starts up basketball in the gym, choirs practice in the music room, ministries meet in flexible classrooms, small groups gather in the commons, teens play on the East Wesley Lawn, and our middle school students move in to the labs and classrooms.

Keeping the legacy of the old Hyland Center alive, we salvaged much of the limestone for re-use on the new Hyland Center and reused the wood bleacher seats to create a cross backdrop in the gym for Mass, theater surround, and display wall in the art room.

A statue of St. Marguerite d'Youville will be placed at the entry, reminding us of how our founding families, the Grey Nuns of the Sacred Heart, and Monsignor Moylan built Christ the King in the middle of the depression. We are grateful for their sacrifice and ability to continue their legacy of providing for the sprititual, pastoral, and educational needs of our community.

We extend sincere gratitude for all donors to the campaign. Because of these stewards, we are able to undertake the next chapter in our history and Continue His Mission to know, love, serve, and teach as Jesus did.



- Music and liturgy that opens our hearts to God and helps us learn to love and serve our neighbors, and live together in peace.


2018 - 2019 fiscal year
