The PVA supports community outreach with our CKS Serves Committee. This committee facilitates service activities for students and their families; our students volunteered over 1,400 hours of their time through these events. Volunteer opportunities included making Christmas Boxes of Joy for children in need, providing dinners to students through Agape Youth and Family Center, writing letters to senior citizens, donating sides for Thanksgiving meals, and packing over 10,000 meals for the Rise Against Hunger Program.

The Staff Appreciation Committee provides monthly lunches and goodies, the Birthday Recognition Committee treats the faculty & staff to a lunch on their birthday, and the PVA Executive Committee organizes a Christmas and end-of-year collection that is given as a bonus to every school employee.
