

Decree

Whereas Celiac disease afflicts a number of Catholics throughout the Archdiocese of Atlanta;

And whereas the Apostolic See has granted the faculty to ordinaries to permit the use of low-gluten hosts by the lay faithful; (CDF Prot. 89/78-174 98)

And whereas executive power delegated by the Apostolic See may in turn be subdelegated, either in an individual case or for all cases; (CIC 137 §2)

Desiring to remove all unnecessary obstacles to the reception of Holy Communion by the lay faithful who are properly disposed;

Now, therefore, I, Wilton Daniel Gregory, Archbishop of Atlanta, do hereby delegate to all priests of the Archdiocese of Atlanta in good standing the authority to permit reception of Holy Communion confected in a low gluten host by those among the laity suffering from Celiac disease, either for a single instance or habitually. This delegated authority takes effect and may be exercised immediately upon the promulgation of this decree.
