





Archdiocesan Assessment

Parishes contribute a portion of their collections to fund the operations of the Archdiocese.

Archbishop's Annual Appeal

Parishes participate to assist the Archbishop in his ministry to our local church. A portion of this money comes back to the parish.

Offertory Collections


This money is directed by the donor to specific ministries like: Faith Formation, Community Outreach, Military, St. Vincent de Paul, Friends of St. Martín de Porres. Theater Ministry, etc.

We Heard You and Share...

- Our Women's Club hosted Breakfast with Santa, the Easter Egg Hunt and a Trunk or Treat.
- The Knights of Columbus sponsored their annual Fish Fry serving over 2,718 meals.
- Over 4,800 sandwiches were made and taken by the Sandwich Ministry to feed the hungry in Atlanta.
- We hosted two blood drives securing almost 400 pints of blood, saving many lives.
- The Troop Support Ministry sent over 3,695 packages to our troop overseas over the last ten years.
- Each year, our Advent Giving Tree increases, this year collecting and delivering to over 500 people.
- Street People held their annual play, Honeymoon in Vegas, benefitting St. Martín de Porres with \$7,000.
- 1,000 prayer blankets given, to those with both with physical and spiritual needs.
- St. Vincent de Paul raised over \$100,000 and were able to assist families with rent, utilities, and temporary lodging.
- St. Martín de Porres assisted 16,558 households, serving 78,632 people. This included 397,445 pounds of food along with 2,392 turkey or ham dinners for Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter.
- Our Lady of Guadalupe Committee, CRHP- Spanish and Charismatic Prayer Group continually raised funds to support parish activities.
- The Rosary Makers have made and sent over 3,000 rosaries to other countries.
- Our Lady Of Guadalupe tournament had 18 teams, which included 96 adults and 100 children, continuing to raise funds to support parish activities.
- Upgraded the Friary with energy efficient windows thanks to Quinn Windows. We recommended them!
- The return of our Living Stations of the Cross was well received with over 700 in attendance.
- We assisted 2 of our parish families when their homes were destroyed by fire.
- Ben Murkison completed his Eagle Scout requirements by leading Troop 15 in building bleachers for our soccer fields.
- We were able to give over 400 pairs of slightly used shoes to The Soul Project.
- We collected back to school supplies for NETworks.
- Donation of overhead spotlights by T&G Controls, owned by parishioners Steve and Marta Lane.
- Thanks to our ground committee and Randy Sharp of Premier Growers for all lovely seasonal flowers.

As We Look to the Future...

- Discipleship training for all ministry leaders.
- Promoting parish registration and updating our parish database with photos.
- Plan to upgrade our Church seating.
- We will refurbish all exterior doors and railings.
- Install a handicap doors in the Church.
- Adding a Ga Ga Ball court.
- Renovate St. Martin de Porres office, making it more efficient and welcoming.
- Looking into the feasibility of turf for our soccer field.
- Placing overhead projectors in classrooms and the parish hall.
- Study the possibility of a new key system for the campus.
- Upgrade our Saint corner with additional images and statues.
