Archdiocesan Assessment

Parishes contribute a portion of their collections to fund the operation's of the Archdiocese.

Archbishop's Annual Appeal

Parishes participate to assist the Archbishop in his ministry to our local church. A portion of this money comes back to the parish.

Offertory Collections

- Covers salaries and benefits for the
- employees of the Church.

Capital Fund

- This money goes directly to our Building Fund to be used for any capital projects. It allows us to grow our physical capacity and to enrich our spiritual environment.

– Committed to save \$50K each


Individual Ministries This money is directed by the donor to specific ministries like:
