
OLA School Financial Report for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2019

Thank you to the OLA School community for another strong financial year. Donations to the Annual Fund for the 2018-19 school year again remained unwavering alongside fund-raising efforts for the Capital Campaign. The Annual Fund provides stability to the financial foundation of OLA School, and it is that strong foundation that allows the school to grow and prosper.

Evidence of growth can be seen most clearly through the success of the OLA School Capital Campaign. Thank you to everyone who has given and/or pledged support for the addition to OLA School. The 2018-19 school year saw your support come to fruition, as staff and students began using the new school building in November of 2018. What a wonderful addition to OLA! Thank you for making it a reality.

Income received for the Capital Campaign during the 2018-19 year totaled \$970,364. OLA School will continue to put 10% of all fundraising efforts toward Capital Campaign costs until the project is paid off.

The cost to educate each child at OLA during the 2018-19 school year was \$10,397 compared to tuition of \$8,950 for Catholic students. The \$1,447 difference is made up through the Annual Fund and other fundraising. Long-range financial stability remains an important goal for OLA School, and that stability depends upon giving through the Annual Fund and other fundraising efforts. Thank you to everyone whose financial support made a successful school year possible.

## ADVANCEMENT

The 2018-2019 Annual Fund raised \$438,123 plus an additional \$48,680 that was put to the Building Fund. Home & School raised \$98,662 plus and additional \$5,717 to the Building Fund. These efforts, combined with monies raised for Grace Scholars of \$62,675, made for a total of \$599,460. All of these generous donations in the 2018-2019 school year helped to cover the tuition gap, outfit two new classrooms, paint throughout the new building, and provide new Chromebooks for middle school students. Parents, grand-parents, faculty and staff, alumni, parents of alumni, parishioners, friends, company matching gifts, and grants all contributed to the success of these efforts. This support keeps OLA financially secure. Many, many thanks to our entire school community.
