

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

The Finance Council serves as a consultative body to our Pastor, Fr. Darragh Griffith, and serves to assist him in fulfilling his duty to be a good steward of parish resources. From the financial perspective, the necessary resources to run such an incredible parish are significant. Below find some important details of our fiscal year July 1, 2018 thru June 30, 2019.

- **2018-2019 Revenue** / Expense Summary Income for the fiscal year totaled \$842,346. This represents a 9% increase over 2018. Expenses for the same period totaled \$808,818, representing a 16% increase in expenses from the prior year. As in years past, MOQ was able to meet its financial obligations; therefore, our income exceeded our expenses by \$33,528, representing 4% of total income.
- **Long term Debt** The mortgage owed to the Archdiocese is still pending. There are a few outstanding invoices and other items that need to be resolved before the note is finalized. The note will be approximately 3.9 million.
- Capital Campaign The Finance board would like to thank all the parishioners at MOQ who participated in one or more of the past campaigns. The outstanding pledges to be collected from Bridging the Gap total \$643,630. Several families have not only paid their pledge but have continued to make ongoing donations. Please know that it is important to the success of the Parish that all individuals and families follow through with completing their pledge.
- Charitable Contributions Each year we are humbled by the support that parishioners give to the many charities supported by Mary Our Queen. In 2018-2019 our Parish family donated \$104,293 to charity. We generously donated \$84,337 to St. Vincent De Paul Society as direct aid to the poor located right here in Peachtree Corners. In addition, we funded through second collections, a total of \$19,956 to a variety of charities. As a Parish, charitable contributions increased 18% over last year and represented 12% of our total income to serve the needs of all communities.
- **Finance Committee Overview** We would like to encourage the congregation to continue to exceed the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal. Our current obligation totals \$56,100 for the year ending 12/31/2019. Please note that 90% of funds in excess of our obligation come back to Mary Our Queen. It is a welcome source of income and truly helps us meet our annual budget.

As of November 2019, Mary Our Queen families totaled 899. This is an increase of 82 families from 2018. As expenses continue to rise, your financial support is much appreciated and ensures we are able to meet all expenses for the year. As in past years, we attempt to maintain a conservative budget to plan for the unexpected. We are experiencing significant expenses due to the new worship space, increased maintenance and updates to both the Trinity building and our existing Parish Life Center.

With the generosity of our Parish community, along with the fiscal responsibility of our pastor and staff, we maintain a path of financial stability heading into Fiscal year 2019/2020. Fr. Darragh and the Parish leadership are committed to be responsible stewards of our Parish financial gifts and resources. Fr. Darragh and the Finance Council are devoted to transparency of financial matters with respect to the parish.

We wish to extend our appreciation to the entire office staff, Pastor Fr. Darragh, and as always, the parishioners at Mary Our Queen. Your financial support allows us to meet the ongoing needs of the Parish and assures our continued success.


