Parish Revenue

Offertory includes money collected in the baskets at Mass and on-line giving

<u>Donations</u> are bequests and other gifts made to the parish outside of ordinary offertory contributions. These gifts are not included in the budget process and cannot be expected to occur each year <u>Interest</u> is earned on savings and investment accounts held by the Archdiocese

<u>Special Ministries</u> income includes sports fees, donations collected for specific ministries including Martha's Ministry, Theater Ministry, More Eats, S Factor, etc.

<u>Religious Education</u> income includes activity fees, youth mission trip and summer camp fees.

Other Income comes from other sources including interest earned on our Catholic Foundation Endowment Fund and Grants awarded to STM

Parish Expenses

<u>Administration</u> includes support for priests, administrative staff salaries and fixed costs such as insurance and parish communications <u>Archdiocesan Assessments</u> supports various Archdiocesan ministries, including the education and formation of Archdiocesan seminarians and Archdiocesan schools

<u>Social Justice</u> includes grants and support to charitable organizations outside of our parish

<u>Liturgy & Music</u> expenses comprise those costs directly associated with our liturgical celebrations

<u>Special Ministries</u> provide for parish life programs including sports, theater, seniors, nursery, fellowship, etc.

<u>Religious Education</u> are expenses related to the education and faith formation of adults, teens, children, including the RCIA program <u>Operations</u> -- utilities, repair and maintenance, transportation, professional services and other variable costs associated with the facilities and grounds of the parish

<u>Capital Expenses</u> include the allotments toward replacement or addition of furniture, equipment and buildings

<u>Rectory</u> includes maintenance and upkeep on the rectory building less rent paid by non-STM resident priests

Revenue minus expense includes onetime unexpected income of \$311,845 from the Appeal rebate and a parishioner bequest.

Archdiocese Second Collections:

Archdiocese of Atlanta mandates Second Collections that are collected in pew and via online giving during various weekends throughout the year. The funds collected are not included in STM income, but are sent directly to the Archdiocese for distribution to the intended beneficiaries.

STM Second Collections:

STM has three in-house collections for various beneficiaries: OLPH on Thanksgiving Day; Missionaries of the Poor, on Good Friday; and Serve Haiti, on Ash Wednesday. The funds collected are not included in STM income, but are sent directly to the intended beneficiaries.


Prior to January 2019, all STM SVDP donations were processed directly by SVDP; since that time, STM took over processing STM SVDP donations and the funds are distributed directly to STM SVDP chapter. The funds are not included in STM income.


STM Parish Policy for Surplus Funds:


On November 2, 2016, after discussion and careful consideration, the Finance Council ("Council) of St. Thomas More Parish recommended that the Parish establish an Emergency Fund ("Fund") for use for unexpected/unbudgeted expense items needed for the good of the Parish, and that a balance equivalent of five (5) months budgeted operating expenses be maintained in this Fund. A balance equivalent of two (2) months of these Emergency funds will be held in the Operating Checking account, with the remaining three (3) months being held in an interest bearing savings account, (DL 530 account).


In the event that such Fund is drawn upon, any Surplus ("Surplus" is defined as any funds left at the end of the fiscal year in excess of the budgeted amount) shall be used to replenish the Fund. If the Surplus is insufficient to replenish the Fund, the Surplus is to be applied to the deficit and any remaining deficit to the Fund be replenished as a budget item in the next fiscal year, to the extent possible.

On September 18, 2019, the Council recommended the following amendment to this STM Policy for Surplus Funds: If the Fund has not been drawn upon, or if there is a remaining Surplus after the Fund has been brought back to the minimum amount, the Council recommends that those Surplus funds be deposited in the interest bearing Social Justice savings account, (DL 1134 account) in order to maintain a balance equal either to \$300,000 or to a total of the prior two (2) years of Social Justice expenses, whichever is greater. Any remaining Surplus funds is to be deposited into the interest bearing Capital Improvement savings account, (DL 885 account).
