ABOUT STM SCHOOL

Saint Thomas More Catholic School opened on September 1, 1950, with approximately 140 children in grades one through five. The Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur staffed the school. Grades six, seven, and eight were added in successive years. In 2016, STM School became the Archdiocese of Atlanta's only parochial primary school in the Jesuit Tradition. Classes range from kindergarten through eighth grade with two classes per grade level. A comprehensive curriculum is provided in mathematics, science, language arts, social studies, as well as religion, foreign language, computer technology, music/band/chorus, art, and physical education.

Saint Julie Billiart is the patron saint of the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur, beloved founders of Saint Thomas More School. The statue shown below is in the school's main entry hallway and is passed by students every day. Our Saint Julie now wears a protective face mask, setting an example for all of our on-site students, faculty and staff during these extraordinary times.
